Chelsea Clinton orders Koran commentary?

TEHRAN (Reuters) - An Iranian newspaper said on Monday that U.S. President Bill Clinton's daughter, Chelsea, had ordered a 20-volume commentary on the Muslim holy book, the Koran, from the Islamic research center in Iran.

The daily Tehran Times quoted the head of the center, Kamal Faqih Imani, as saying Chelsea Clinton "had applied for a copy of the English version of the Koran exegesis...which was sent to her." He did not say how Chelsea had ordered the book.

Hunger strike over leaf-blower ban

LOS ANGELES (Reuters) - It's hardly a cause most people would consider dying for, but 11 gardeners in Los Angeles feel so strongly about a citywide ban on gas-powered leaf-blowers that they have gone on a hunger strike.

"What keeps us going is that we have justice and truth in our society and we are here for a righteous cause," Adrian Alvarez, one of the strikers, told reporters Monday.

The 11, most of them Mexican immigrants who make a living tending the gardens of the rich and sometimes famous in Los Angeles, have taken nothing but liquids since Saturday.

Aliens speak Croatian -- who'd have thought?

ZAGREB, Croatia (Reuters) - A peasant farmer chatted in Croatian to four aliens who landed in his field as he tended his cattle, Vecernji List daily has reported.

Jako Vrancic, a pensioner living near the coastal town of Sibenik, said the four extra-terrestrials landed quietly in an iron-shaped spacecraft next to the spot where he was working.

"I felt no fear, as I had previously seen things like this on TV," said the pensioner who is well liked in his village and described as an honest and down-to-earth man by his friends.

Vrancic said the aliens were quite short and had the frame of a child.

"We had no problem communicating as they spoke a broken form of Croatian," said Vrancic, adding that he had offered them ham and dried figs, but they refused and said they were not hungry.

Vandals decapitate Little Mermaid

COPENHAGEN, Denmark (Reuters) - Police divers were hunting on Tuesday for the head of the Little Mermaid statue on Copenhagen's wa-



terfront after vandals sawed it off overnight.

Police said the city's best-known landmark was decapitated with a grinding machine in the early hours of the morning and they had sent divers into the harbor in the hope of finding the head.

The Little Mermaid statue, based on a fairy tale by Danish author Hans Christian Andersen, is visited by hundreds of thousands of tourists every year.

Since its erection in 1913, it has been daubed with paint several times but has only had its head removed once before, in 1964.

Who draws comics anymore?

Does anyone know that name of Todd McFarlane? How about Rob Liefeld? They are two comic book artists of high renown and have similar pasts. Both of them started out at Marvel Comics (big name, largest of the comic book fat cats) on small projects and worked their way up to work on regular books. They both worked on the best selling Marvel title groups: X-men books and Spiderman books. They brought life and a sense of pride back to these falling books... but what do they do once they are popular enough. They leave. Along with a few friends (mostly ARTIST and hardly any WRITERS) and start a new independant company, Image.

You might have heard of Todd

McFarlane's creation at Image. His name is Spawn, and as a character he has "spawned" numerous spin-offs, toys, and even a movie. But who draws Spawn today? Greg Capullo. Todd hasn't done Spawn since issue 25 and Spawn is getting into the 50's. Rob Liefeld alone has created over 10 new titles for image. Most of them have died before reaching 20...some of the most successful (ie. not dead yet) are Supreme and Youngblood. He has gotten a reputation of drawing a few issues, maybe just covers, and then leaving to start something new. He has no regular book.

I don't want to single out just these two guys. Many great comic book artists of our time (even some writers) have disappeared into either private projects or the marketing of their creations. As a writer Neil Gaiman is superb (Sandman, Books of Magic) but he has not written most of the books that still ride of the fame of his earlier work in a few YEARS. (he has a new comic, Stardust, out which is a wonderful project with Charles Vess drawing... it's beautiful)

So my advice to you fanboy (or fan-girl) is to get out there and read the good stuff...as alway, but make sure that you are buying the work of genius and not some poor attempt to sell mediocre material in it's guise.

The KGB Story (Part 2)

In KGB, they don't need to live up to anyone else's standards of what they should be-- they are the clowns, and can behave exactly as they like. In an environ ment with as high a level of stress as CMU has, this is desperately needed.

"I think there's something very necessary about an organization dedicated to silliness, because of the CMU mys tique," says Mike Gelman, KGB's current president, "There's a lot of pressure here, and its an important safety valve."

Jay agrees "[Forming KGB] was a chance to get together with people who were different, who didn't take everything at CMU so really seriously. It was just a chance for silliness."

KGB gives its membership a means by which to redirect their stress, however, sometimes this, too, can be destructive. For the first three years of its existence, one of the main goals of KGB was to participate in Spring Carnival.

During Spring Carnival, student organizations are encouraged to build game booths for the midway. These booths are then judged, and the winning booths get an awards.

The first year that it competed, KGB took fifth place and received the "Chairman's Choice Award," given to new organizations.

In its second and third years, Tom Strong, was a driving force behind KGB's booths, "The general idea [during the second year] was, 'Yeah, KGB should build a booth.' That became the temporary goal of the organization, 'To build booth and win,' and we built a booth and we won, I think a fraternity beat us by one point.

"Too many people wanted to try to do it again...enough people wanted to do it again that they formed a booth committee [the next year] and started the ball rolling. As opposed to what it had been before, when most of the organiza tion was in favor of building it, it had started to become just a slight majority who were saying 'Yeah build it,' and not even all of them wanted to help.

Jim Zalenka also worked on the

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third KGB booth. "When it actually became time to build the booth, many of the people who had made commitments before, who had expressed opinions on what booth should be like, and how it should be built, failed to show up to building session, which left the building in the hand of people who didn't agree with what was being done. There was a lot of resentment over that."

Tensions were running high. Friendships were strained and sometimes broken. General Meetings of the membership, which had, before, maintained an upbeat tone of restrained silliness, became grim and angry. Long debates over trivial or silly orders of business followed. These culminated in a forty-five minute debate over whether or not to buy a piece of computer equipment which would drain the entire treasury of its assets, making it impossible to complete booth. A number of people walked out angrily during the debate. In the end, it was determined that the equipment would actually cost more than the contents of the treasury, so the entire debate (which originally started as nothing more than a joke) had been for nothing.

Carnival came and went. An effort was made to finish booth, however most members lacked the enthusiasm of previous years. As a result KGB came in second to last. KGB had depleted its treasury, members of the booth-committee were over-worked trying to find time to both build booth and do their school work, and, for the first time in its history, KGB had become divided.

It was decided not to do booth again. The friction within the group was not worth the effort.

I talked with Mike Gelman about he period following the third booth, "A lot of what we did was focussed towards carnival. A lot of what we did in terms of more serious things, like fund-raising, was focussed so that we could have enough money to do booth. A lot of the drive went away, then booth became less important, so we've lost sort of a tangible goal and have gone to a more general goal of being a social organization.

"One of the things which we are trying to do now is supporting many things that, although its unlikely that one

person will want to go to all of them, there will be something for everyone.

"The direction which I want to see KGB going in, is back to the roots. We're doing this because we're funny people. We entertain ourselves and we entertain the world at large. We enjoy being funny, so we're going to be funny."

"I think the organization has changed radically in the last two years. I think its going to change radically in the next two years. I think that when we come back for our twenty-fifth reunions, and we go to see if KGB is still meeting, I think it'll still be there. I think the core idea of KGB is that we're here to have fun. That will always be with us. Even if KGB as an organization ceases to exist in the distant future, there will always be a KGB, even if its not called KGB."

With that he pauses for a moment, and then looks up, "Wow, that's mystical," he says with a smile.
